Professional development webinars to develop effective feedback strategies Agreement of new marking policy to help focus feedback on children's needs and reduce workload. Focus on getting writing back on track		
Delivery of a programme to address issues in reading and writing through small group tutoring through the National Tuition Programme in upper KS2 for those identified as falling behind and not making accelerated progress yet at EXS and GDS. This will include regular sessions maintained over a sustained period and carefully timetabled to enable consistent delivery.	Progress will be tracked against targets set in writing for each year group prior to school closures.	£6,600
Additional support and focus on reading and/or maths		
Tuition and boosters provided by school staff, linked to the curriculum and focused on the areas where pupils would most benefit from additional practice or feedback (individual or small group – dependent on need). Purchase of Oxford Owls e-library to facilitate reading at home	Progress will be tracked against all targets set for each year group prior to school closures	£1,100 £500
Purchase of subject-specific assessments to identify particular areas where pupils have forgotten or misunderstood key concepts, to enable high quality gap analysis and ensure that new material being covered builds on secure foundations.	Progress will be tracked against targets set in each subject for each year group prior to school closures.	£500
Tuition provided through the National Tuition Programme for most vulnerable children, LAC and Post LAC in agreement with VSK	Progress will be tracked against targets in PEPs	£2160

Interventions by Pastoral Teaching Assistant focusing on other aspects of learning, such as behaviour or pupils' social and emotional needs, supporting them in the self-regulation of their behaviour.
